**RATIFYING THE MDRRMC RESOLUTION NO. 01-2011,  
APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY THREE MILLION FIVE  
HUNDRED THIRTY SEVEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY NINE  
AND NINETY FIVE CENTAVOS (PHP 23,537,469.95) REPRESENTING  
THE FIVE PERCENT (5%) MDRRMC FUND, FY 2011 AND THE  
ATTACHED MDRRMC PLAN WHICH SHALL BE CONSIDERED AN  
INTEGRATED PART HEREOF**

WHEREAS, the General Welfare Clause of R.A. 7160, includes among the conceivable functions of every local government unit, the protection of its inhabitants from the harmful effects of natural disaster or calamities;

WHEREAS, consistent to this mandates, the Sangguniang Bayan enacted Ordinance No. 3 which created the MDRRMO of Taytay, Rizal, tasked with the formulation of disaster preparedness programs and other disaster related activities to promote and ensure public safety;

WHEREAS, the MDRRMC has adopted its Resolution 01-2011, which appropriated the above stated amount representing the Five Percent (5%) MDRRM Fund, to bankroll its programs and activities as outlined in the MDRRM Plan;


WHEREAS, considering the critical tasks which the MDRRMO assumes in disaster preparedness program and for it to effectively discharge the functions expected from it, funds needed to support its operation and related activities be ratified by the Sangguniang Bayan;



**A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY-THREE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE PESOS AND NINETY-FIVE CENTAVOS (P23,537,469.95) REPRESENTING THE 5% MUNICIPAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT (MDRRM) FUND FY2011 FOR VARIOUS PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND ACTIVITY PERTAINING TO DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT**

**WHEREAS** Section 16 of the General Welfare Clause of RA 7160 provides in part that every local government unit shall exercise powers necessary for its efficient and effective governance and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

**WHEREAS** RA 10121 or the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 provides in part that the MDRRM Fund shall be utilized to finance disaster risk management activities such as pre-disaster preparedness programs including trainings, purchase of life saving rescue equipment, supplies and medicines, for post-disaster activities including relief and recovery programs, and for the payment of premiums on calamity insurance;




**WHEREAS** After thorough deliberation and motion of Acting DPRM Officer Mr. Di Lere Cayton duly seconded by Budget Officer David Z. Atanacio, the MDRRM Council unanimously approved, hereby officially adopted Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (MDRRM-AP).

**NOW THEREFORE** BE IT RESOLVED THAT the amount of Twenty-three Million Five Hundred Thirty-seven Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-nine Pesos and Ninety-five Centavos (P23,537,469.95) representing the 5% MDRRM Fund is hereby appropriated for the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan.

**RESOLUTION** This resolution shall be disseminated to all concerned parties and duly constituted higher authorities for their information and appropriate action pursuant to existing laws.


